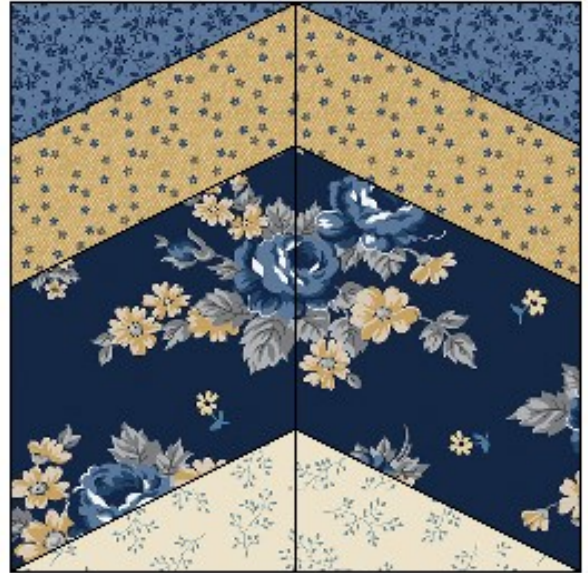
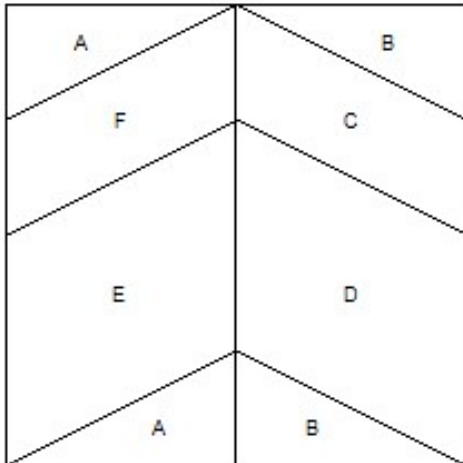


Center Angle Block



1. Print the templates on cardstock and cut them out for the Center Angle Block . Printing on Card weight paper is sufficient for this exercise. If you don't have cardstock, attaching to a layer of freezer paper will help the templates lay flat while cutting your pieces.



2. Using the fabrics for your quilt, cut each piece using the appropriate template. You will need four each of C, D, E, F and 4 each of A and B in one direction and 4 each of A and B mirrored. See Diagram above and layout your Templates as shown and then the fabric pieces that match before assembly.

Hint to expedite cutting: With right sides folded together, you can cut 1 piece (like F) and when open you will have both F and C cut as they are mirrored. Same goes for E & D as D is a mirror of E. Again for A & B on the Bottom and again for A & B of the top. You can lay up to 4 layers of fabric together, cut with a ruler and rotary cutter, and remain accurate. More than four layers your pieces will not all be the same size.

Rotary Cutting Recommendation: When cutting straight lines, align your 1/4 in Seam Line on the ruler with the Seam Line on your template. Do not line your ruler edge with the cutting line. This method will ensure you end up with an accurate block when sewing 1/4" seams.



3. First assemble each column (A,F,E,A) and (B,C,D,B) and press each column in opposite directions. This allows your seams to nest nicely when attaching the two pieces together. Press your final center seam nice and flat in either direction.
